**National Prescription Drug Take Back Day Results**

This October marked the 14th National Drug Takeback Day, a biannual initiative coordinated by the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) that aims to provide safe disposal sites for community members to dispose of their unused or expired prescription medications. Across Illinois and within the local community, it was a success marked by record breaking statewide participation:

As a part of our own Substance Abuse Prevention Programs, the Positive Youth Development (PYD) team helped spread the word about Drug Takeback Day. Local drop-off sites included the Palatine Police Department, Hanover Park Police Department, and, for the first year ever, the Elk Grove Village Police Department. The results were encouraging; Palatine collected five full boxes of unused prescription drugs, Elk Grove Village collected two, and Hanover Park ended the day with three full boxes of prescription drugs.

**Community Health Updates from Your Teen  
Pregnancy Prevention (TPP) Program**

December celebrates the continued decline in national teen pregnancy rates, which we are working to reinforce in our service area through Teen Pregnancy Prevention initiatives in school districts throughout Hanover Park. These initiatives provide regular opportunities for students to ask anonymous questions about matters relating to sex, pregnancy avoidance, sexually transmitted infection (STI) prevention, and healthy/unhealthy relationships. In light of larger national conversations about sexual violence, students have been asking questions about consent, legality, due process, and sexual harassment. Some recent questions include;

*"If you get raped or touched and you don't know if that person has STDs, can you be affected?" and, "If your partner wants to touch your lower body, can you slap them or avoid them?"*



Such questions demonstrate a real need for more information about sexual violence and consent. At the end of the training, Dylan was able to conduct a community assessment, identify local risk and protective factors, and develop a logic model. Dylan has been able to transfer this knowledge to other YAC and CPYD Coalition members. Here is the District 211 YAC update from Dylan:
